

Elwyn to Wawa Service Restoration Project Service Update August 5, 2022

In advance of service to the new Wawa Station starting on Sunday, August 21, SEPTA will continue running test trains on the restored track between Elwyn and Wawa. Between now and the start of service on the 21st, SEPTA engineers and crew will be training and getting qualified on the new segment at various times throughout the day. Trains will be running at normal operating speeds of approximately 45 MPH along the length of the line and through the grade crossing at Lenni Road. During earlier signal system testing in July, trains were operating at approximately 20 MPH. All residents, motorists and pedestrians are reminded to "[Make the Safe Choice](#)" and stay out of the track area and stop at grade crossings.
