

## PennDOT to Begin Construction on Glen Riddle Road Bridge Replacement in Middletown Township, Delaware County

**King of Prussia, PA** – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that construction is scheduled to begin Monday, April 1, to replace the bridge carrying Glen Riddle Road over Chrome Run Creek in Middletown Township, Delaware County.

Motorists are advised of the following travel restriction:

- Monday, **April 1**, through Thursday, **November 21**, a **24/7 closure is scheduled on Glen Riddle Road between Brandywine Drive and Wrights Lane**. During the closure, motorists will be directed to use Glen Riddle Road, Route 352 (Middletown Road), and Route 452 (Pennell Road).

Local access will be maintained for residents and businesses. Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling through or near the work area because backups and delays will occur. All scheduled activities are weather dependent.

Under this contract, PennDOT's contractor will replace the 92-year-old, 30-foot-wide, 31-foot-long concrete encased steel beam structure with a prestressed concrete box beam bridge that will measure 31 feet in width and 40 feet in length. The new bridge will allow for wider lanes and shoulders to improve traffic safety for the estimated 4,415 motorists who travel over the structure daily.

Other improvements include new signing and roadway design features through pavement markings; milling and resurfacing; drainage and guide rail replacements.

Richard E. Pierson Construction Co., Inc. of Woodstown, New Jersey, is the general contractor on the \$1,272,182 project which is financed with 100 percent state funds. The entire project is expected to finish in the fall of 2024.
